## **Nouns**

*A noun is the name of a person, place or thing. Nouns can be proper, common, collective or abstract.*

**A proper noun** can be the name of a person, place, institution, day, month and so on. A proper noun begins with a capital letter.

**Lee Hookey** is a proper noun. In the introduction below, underline all of the proper nouns.

"After scoring 18 tries at St George last season, Lee Hookey is back with his beloved South Sydney this year and they will be hoping he can emulate that feat again this year. Vibe caught up with Lee to ask him about his return to the Rabbitohs."

**A common noun** names objects, concepts and places. Common nouns do not have capital letters.

High school is a common noun. Write down 10 common nouns from the article on Lee Hookey. (Pages 4-5)

A *collective noun* describes a group of people, places or things and is specific to the particular group, for example, a *herd* of elephants, a *crowd* of people, a *box* of crayons, a *pad* of paper.

Write down five collective nouns of your own and write each of them in a sentence below.

An *abstract noun* names things that cannot be touched or that have no physical form - things such as ideas, concepts and feelings. Examples of abstract nouns might be *sorrow, love, research, beauty, difficulty* and *experience*.

From the article, find abstract nouns that have the following meanings.
